
RIVER FLOODING | 60'S | DRYING | FOG

WESTERN WASHINGTON
AIR QUALITY FIRE WEATHER FLOODING WIND GUSTS FREEZING TEMPS
GOOD NONE WARNING 8-10 40'S

SUMMARY: Snohomish County Rivers are receding this morning after reaching Flood Stage after several rivers were issued Flood Warnings in the last 24 hours. A major log jam affecting Hwy 2 is being cleared to prevent damage. Some dense fog advisory for some areas.



WEATHER: Mostly sunny and dry for Wednesday and Thursday. Highs will be in the mid-50s to mid-60s with the warmest temperatures on Thursday, and lows will be in the upper 30s and 40s. Rain will return on Friday with highs in the mid-50s to lower 60s, and with lows in the 40s.



RIVER FLOODING: The only remaining reach above flood stage is the Snoqualmie River near Carnation. It crested around 9 PM Tuesday and remains above moderate flood stage early this morning. The Snoqualmie near Carnation will continue to recede today, falling below flood stage Wednesday afternoon or evening. The Snohomish River is below flood stage; there is a chance it could rise to near flood stage Wednesday afternoon or evening as the crest from the Snoqualmie River passes. No further flooding is expected for the rest of the week.
