## G1 GEOMAGNETIC WATCH | DRY | 60'S

AIR QUALITY FIRE WEATHER FLOODING WIND GUSTS FREEZING TEMPS

**SUMMARY**: Crews continue to remove logs that pose a threat to the Ebby Island Slough structure at Hwy 2 in Snohomish County. G1 Geomagnetic Storm may cause the Aurora to be visible today and tomorrow.


















**WEATHER:** Mostly sunny and dry again on Thursday, with some patchy morning fog. Friday looks to have rain, especially in the northern part of Western Washington. Sunny and dry weather returns on Saturday and looks to continue into early next week.



<u>G1-Geomagnetic Storm Watch:</u> The Aurora may be visible to some areas from the 24-25<sup>th</sup> of October. These events can also disrupt communications, satellite transmissions, and, when more powerful, the electrical distribution grid.



**RIVER FLOODING:** All rivers have receded below flood stage, and no additional river flooding is forecast. Pictured is the Ebby Slough log jam affecting Hwy 2 in Snohomish County.
