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M6.3 OREGON QUAKE | THUNDERSTORM

WIND GUSTS EXCESSIVE HEAT AIR QUALITY FIRE WEATHER RIVER FLOODING

SUMMARY: A magnitude 6.3 earthquake occurred this morning off the Oregon Coast 150 miles from Bandon, OR. Thunderstorms forecasted for Cascade foothills.







WEATHER: Scattered showers and thunderstorms. Mostly cloudy, high near 77. Chance of precipitation is 50%. Overnight a chance of showers and thunderstorms before midnight. Friday partly sunny, high near 78.



OREGON EARTHQUAKE: A magnitude 6.3 earthquake near the coast of Oregon occurred as the result of strikeslip faulting along the Blanco Fracture Zone, a transform fault marking the boundary between the Pacific Plate to the southwest and the Juan de Fuca Plate to the northeast. No tsunami as a result of the event.

HURRICANE DORIAN:

Hurricane Dorian is forecast to strengthen to a major hurricane while shifting north of the Bahamas through Saturday. The risk of dangerous storm surge and hurricane-force winds later this week and this weekend continues to increase



in the central and northwestern Bahamas and along the Florida east coast. Heavy rain from Dorian may cause lifethreatening flash floods.
