WEATHER: Gradual warming is expected for Western Washington this week, with Tuesday & Wednesday expected to be the warmest days. **High temperatures are expected to reach the mid to upper 80s, with lower 90s possible in some locations.** Those sensitive to the heat should take the proper precautions.



Practice HEAT SAFETY Wherever You Are

Heat related deaths are preventable. Protect yourself and others from the impacts of heat waves.

Job Sites
Stay hydrated and take breaks in the shade as often as possible.

Indoors
Check up on the elderly, sick and those without AC.

Vehicles
Never leave kids or pets unattended - LOOK before you LOCK

Limit strenuous outdoor activities, find shade, and stay hydrated.

HEAT PREPAREDNESS: The Heat Risk level will be the highest on Tuesday and Wednesday across the region. During this time, there will be a moderate risk of heat-related impacts for heat-sensitive individuals or those without effective cooling and/or adequate hydration.

- Homeless, the elderly, children and those already with health issues are the most at risk.
- Increased risk to children and pets left unattended in hot vehicles or outdoors.
- Dehydration could impact those sensitive to heat who do not take precautions.
