


WEATHER: Sunny, high near 63 low around 43. Wednesday mostly cloudy, high near 62 low around 48.

THUNDERSTORMS: There are two peak periods for thunderstorm season in Western Washington - spring and fall. Why? Those are the times of year when the surface (where we live) is still 'warm' while colder air aloft from the Gulf of Alaska follows cold fronts. That colder air aloft destabilizes the air mass, promotes rising air from the surface (analogy - boiling water in a pot on the stove), resulting in showers and thunderstorms. The Puget Sound Convergence Zone also provide a source of 'lift' to help generate these showers and thunderstorms.
